



Scenario 1: New Institution & New Team with 1-2 Member Athletes

Process:

1. Register/Confirm Interest in joining USCSA with National Office at help@uscsa.com
2. Inquire with your Institution about starting a club sports program/team
3. Team Captain/Coach Confirms competition availability & inclusion in Conference with Conference Coordinator
4. National Office will add new Institution to Registration
5. Member Athletes register individually and pays individual registration dues

Costs:

- USCSA National Individual Membership Fee: \$15 Annual Due per Member Athlete
- Conference Dues: Determined by Conference Coordinator

*** Individuals without a registered team/institution are not eligible for Team Scoring and Team Awards at Regional or National Championships ***

Scenario 2: New Institution & New Team with 3+ Member Athletes

Process:

1. Register/Confirm Interest in joining USCSA with National Office at help@uscsa.com
2. Inquire with your Institution about starting a club sports program/team
3. Team Captain/Coach Confirms competition availability & inclusion in Conference with Conference Coordinator
4. National Office will add new Institution to Registration
5. Team Captain/Coach Registers team and pays any team/institution dues
6. Member Athletes register individually and pays individual registration dues

Costs:

- USCSA National Individual Membership Fee: \$15 Annual Due per Member Athlete
- USCSA Institution Fee: \$160*
- USCSA Team Fee: \$160** Annual Due per team (i.e. Male Alpine, Female Nordic etc.)
- Conference Dues: Determined by Conference Coordinator

*New Institutions may request a waiver from institution fees for their first year. Team Captains/Coaches MUST send a formal request to registration@uscsa.com detailing why they should be eligible with any supporting documents for the National Office to render a decision. *

Scenario 3: Established Institution & New Team with 1-2 Member Athletes

Process:

1. Team Captain/Coach of New Team registers/confirms interest with currently established USCSA registered teams at their Institution
2. Team Captain/Coach confirms competition availability & inclusion in Conference with Conference Coordinator
3. Member Athletes register individually and pays individual registration dues

Costs:

- USCSA National Individual Membership Fee: \$15 Annual Due per Member Athlete
- USCSA Institution Fee: \$160 Annual Due
- Conference Dues: Determined by Conference Coordinator

*** Institution Fees increase year-to-year to adjust for inflationary costs of the USCSA ***

*** Individuals without a registered team are not eligible for Team Scoring and Team Awards at Regional or National Championships ***

Scenario 4: Established Institution & New Team with 3+ Member Athletes

Process:

1. Team Captain/Coach of New Team registers/confirms interest with currently established USCSA registered teams
2. Team Captain/Coach confirms competition availability & inclusion in Conference with Conference Coordinator
3. Team Captain/Coach Registers team and pays any team/institution dues
4. Member Athletes register individually and pays individual registration dues

Costs:

- USCSA National Individual Membership Fee: \$15 Annual Due per Member Athlete
- USCSA Institution Fee: \$160 Annual Due
- USCSA Team Fee: \$160** Annual Due per team registered (i.e. Male Alpine, Female Nordic etc.)
- Conference Dues: Determined by Conference Coordinator

Messaging

- “The USCSA provides discounts and incentives to students interested in joining our organization and starting a new team at their school. If your institution hasn’t had a team with us before, or hasn’t had an active team in the last 4 years you could be eligible for additional fee waivers to ease start up costs.”
- “The best way to compete with the USCSA is to start a team at your institution and register with either the Athletics Office as a Varsity Sport or Registered Student Organization Office as a Club Sport. There are annual USCSA team and institution dues as well as Conference Dues to be paid before you are eligible to compete. Starting a registered club team and request funding from your institution is a great way to cover these costs. Local fundraising and charging club dues to your members is another way to fund your team.”
- “If you can’t find enough members to field a team (3 or more athletes per discipline) you can compete as an individual representing your institution. Depending on the institution, you may be required to register a Student Organization FIRST before competing with the USCSA. There are discounts for First-Year Teams with 1-2 Member Athletes, but it is **STRONGLY** recommended to grow your team to help with future costs. It’s more fun to compete with friends anyways!”
